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Bridge

An iconic landmark, Langkawi Sky Bridge is one of the world's longest suspension bridges, offering breathtaking views of the island. Suspended seven hundred metres above sea level, the curved bridge is an engineering marvel providing an unobstructed view of the Andaman Sea, the surrounding dense green valley, and extraordinary geological wonders of Machinchang Cambrian Geoforest Park. To reach the Sky Bridge, visitors take a scenic cable car ride from the base of Gunung Machinchang.

The waterfall derives its name from the seven natural pools formed at different levels of the waterfall. According to local legend, the pools are believed to be the bathing place of fairies. Adventurous travellers can hike up to the top of the waterfall for a refreshing dip in the cool, clear waters and enjoy the stunning views of the surrounding rainforest.





Conquering Gunung Raya

trek to the summit of Gunung Raya promises a rewarding adventure for avid hikers and nature enthusiasts. Standing at 881 metres, Gunung Raya is the highest peak in Langkawi. The hike takes you through dense rainforests filled with an array of wildlife. Hornbills, eagles, macaques, the eye-catching dusky leaf monkeys, and flying foxes are commonly sighted here. At the summit, the lookout tower provides a 360-degrees view, stretching as far as Thailand on a clear day, making the challenging ascent well worth the effort.


Bike Tours Through Rice Fields and Local Villages
