This area lies within the significant bio-geographical transition zone known as Wallacea, where Mount Rinjani showcases a remarkable blend of Southeast Asia's lush tropical flora and fauna with Australia's ecological diversity, establishing a unique hotspot for biodiversity.

At the heart of Rinjani lies Segara Anak, a mesmerising crescent-shaped lake known as a spiritual sanctuary. Each year, Balinese pilgrims perform sacred ceremonies honouring the mountain spirit, while Wetu Telu people journey here on a full moon night to offer prayers and seek blessings.
